- Boundary between Hong Kong and Shenzhen + new towns + NDAs + rural areas




Context

- Hong Kong 2030+ (2016):
- Northern Economic Belt to capture economic potential of the boundary location
- Hong Kong 2030+ (2021):
- Northern Metropolis as a new urban area in addition to the main urban area (Harbour Metropolis)
- Northern Metropolis Development Strategy (2021):
- A new engine of economic and urban growth



4 Ps framework for reimagining the northern NT

- A new urban growth area with about 30,000 ha of land, 2,500,000 population, 650,000 employment and a focus for substantial public and private sector investments over the next 20 years
- A holistic and coordinated approach supported by urban innovations is necessary for making the Northern Metropolis a city of tomorrow



4 Ps framework for reimagining the northern NT

- Boundary:
- A *physical barrier* and a dividing force but also *opportunities* from cross boundary interactions, cooperation and integration, leveraging differences between Mainland and Hong Kong
- A 4 Ps framework suggested to reimagine the northern NT from the northern frontier of Hong Kong to a sustainable urban development taking care of:
- o *People:* inclusive community
- o *Prosperity:* economic prosperity
- o *Planet:* environmental sustainability
- *Place:* a unique, diverse and vibrant city of tomorrow
- References for the first 3Ps:
- The 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development with 17 Sustainable Development Goals, "a plan of action for people, planet and prosperity" (United Nations (2015))
- The New Urban Agenda, "a collective vision to promote sustainable urban development" and "to leverage the key role of cities as a driver of sustainable development in an urbanizing world" (United Nations (2017)

Prosperity: Thinking beyond "Two Cities, Three Circles" (雙城三圈)

- The Greater Bay Area (GBA) is a key National City Cluster (城市羣) under National 14th Five-Year- Plan
- The core cities have complex urban systems of their own e.g. Guangzhou Metropolitan Area (廣州都市圏) comprising Guangzhou, Foshan and other complementary cities, Shenzhen Metropolitan Area (深圳都市圏) comprising Dongguan, Huizhou, Shenzhen-Shantau Special Cooperation Zone with complementary functions
- There are technology corridors in east and west GBA
- There are four key cooperation platforms (合作平台) bringing opportunities to Hong Kong including Greater Qianhai (大前海), Nansha (南沙), Lok Ma Chau Loop (河套) and Hengqin (横琴)




Prosperity: Thinking beyond "Two Cities, Three Circles" (雙城三圈)

- The Northern Metropolis should also look beyond Shenzhen for:
- *Physical integration*: based on transport and digital connectivity which compresses the concept of space and time and redefines the commuting circle, business circle and living circle, etc
- o Functional integration: based on comparative advantages
- Positioning itself in the GBA, building up synergy and facilitating flow of people, goods, capital and ideas on different fronts



Prosperity: Thinking beyond "Two Cities, Three Circles" (雙城三圈)

• Internally, the Northern Metropolis should forge *a stronger functional link with the Harbour Metropolis*, for instance a business hub to support closer relationship with the GBA and complementary to three CBDs e.g. Hung Shui Kiu on the Western Economic Corridor.





Prosperity: New economic space to support innovation and technology (I&T) industry

• I&T industry is important to bring new impetus for the Hong Kong economy, to attract economic activities, quality jobs, and talents/local workers, and hence

success of the Northern Metropolis






Prosperity: New economic space to support innovation and technology (I&T) industry

- New economic space to promote I&T not a conventional property development
- Strong industry policy support for I&T, plus:
- *Clear positioning* and specific anchor I&T industries for individual clusters e.g. San Tin, Lok Ma Chau Loop, Hung Shui Kiu, and possibly NT North New Town
- Ecosystem, master planning and key planning and development parameters
- Integration with surrounding community

- Two overseas examples of new economic space to support digital economy
- o Punggol Digital District, Singapore
- o Jurong Innovation District, Singapore



Planet: An environmentally friendly urban development

- Nature has no boundaries. Need to manage water resources, ecosystems, blue and green assets and air quality relevant to GBA and the Northern Metropolis from a regional perspective
- Positively creating and regenerating the environmental capacity in tandem with expanding the development capacity is in line with the advocacy of Hong Kong 2030+
- Not overshooting the environmental limit



People: A people-centric urban development

- Who are the people affected? More innovative solutions?
- Rehousing of clearees (dedicated rehousing estates/ more variety of public housing?)
- Relocation of brownfields and other commercial undertakings (brownfield policy? multi-level compounds?)
- Village removal (more land efficient arrangement?)



People: A people-centric urban development

- Who are the people living in the Northern Metropolis?
- A more diverse population profile: indigenous villagers/ residents, new town/ NDA residents, plus:
- o more local workers, more talents, more business operators, more frequent travellers, more transient population, etc
- Northern Metropolis should be planned for *liveability for all*, not just new residents

• Respecting the urban-rural- countryside-nature continuum of the NT



- Correcting the urban-rural dichotomy approach in the past:
- Tidying up haphazard brownfields
- Upgrading rural areas
- Agriculture and aquafarming revitalisation
- Preserving and revitalizing the heritage of NT
- More orderly Small House developments
- Heritage and culture based rural revitalisation
- An expanded wetland and country park system, etc
- Creating *an inclusive smart, green and resilient city of tomorrow* through the use of technology
