

Foreword

Architectural competitions have a long history of successfully delivering projects by a quality-based and solution-oriented selection procedure for architectural services. They achieve incomparably better results compared to procedures based on price criteria only. The Hong Kong Institute of Architects (HKIA) strives to promote architectural excellence through encouraging clients to adopt architectural competitions as a procurement method for the clients to benefit from more design solutions and to commission the winner to meet the project objectives.

As early as 1992, the HKIA has issued the "HKIA Rules for the Conduct of Architectural Competitions" that sets the principles upon which competitions are based and by which promoters should abide in organizing a competition. The HKIA rules on architectural competition are characterised by the principle of transparency, fairness, objective treatment and non-discrimination. They protect intellectual property and copyright for the participants, encourage early alignment of client-architect relationship, and promote creativity and best practices. The rules benefit both the promoters and the participants.

This guide serves as a quick reference material for the potential architectural competition promoters. It sets out the benefits of running a competition for design ideas or project solutions and outlines the key practical considerations and procedures in managing a design competition, so promoters can plan ahead with sufficient time to obtain the necessary resource and funding.

Value of Design

There is growing recognition of the intrinsic, long-term value of design, which leads to a strong call for creative design solutions that will enhance the quality of life for the users, raise the profile of properties, generate income for the communities and build up the pride of the cities.

What is a competition?

- A design contest to evaluate multiple proposals in a formalised procedure.
- A design competition is a quality-based and solution-oriented form of procurement.
- A design competition allows the Client to procure an optimal high quality project and identify its author the partner with whom to achieve its realization.

Design competitions can be suitable for a whole range of projects in the public and private sectors such as:

- New buildings and engineering structures
- Redevelopment, refurbishment and conservation works
- Landscape and public realm schemes
- Urban planning and masterplanning

Key to a Successful Architectural Competition

- A conscientious Promoter
- A competent Professional Advisor
- A qualified Jury Panel
- A well-developed design brief
- A realistic time schedule
- Provision of precise and relevant reference material & site information
- Clear submission requirement
- Fair, open, transparent rules governing the competition (Conditions of Competition)
- Appropriate prize and remunerations
- Arrangement for implementation of the project

Deciding to Undertake a Competition

The Benefits of Architectural Competitions

- Brings up different approaches and solutions
- Enables comparison of different projects
- It is a process to identify the best qualified team for the project, the one that brought the best solution
- · Identify and promote new design talents
- Generate publicity and raise public awareness
- Provide a valuable opportunity for Promoter and User consensus on design direction and the design team
- Public engagement enriches the consideration of design brief and post competition exhibition collects feedback from community
- Demonstrate a commitment to drive high quality design
- Identify optimalized propositions in regard to quality and economy
- The outcome of a well-briefed competition can outweigh the initial investment

The Limitation of Architectural Competitions

- Offer limited interaction between the design team and the users or other stakeholders at early design stage
- Difficult to address complex programme requirements in a limited time frame
- Little exposure to the trade-offs and alternatives considered in reaching a solution
- Require significant amounts of unpaid time to be spent by a substantial number of architects

Some of the above limitations can be overcome by the project team at the design development stage with the goal of keeping the essence of the winning scheme and balancing the practicality of the project requirements.

Is Competition Appropriate for the Project?

- The project is of public significance
- Requires a wide degree of design exploration
- The site is significant or unusual
- Features a typology that deserves a fresh investigation by the design professionals
- Affects the subsequent design work for the project type or its location
- Generates public interest with positive benefits
- With adequate time and budget for conducting competition

Determining the Competition Type

Competition Purpose

Project Competitions

The aim is to find the best solution for an actual built project and to appoint its author to carry out the commission

Ideas Competitions

Set as an exercise to elucidate aspects of architectural and/or planning problems.

The winner of such a competition is not commissioned to carry out the project and hence, students of architecture may participate, at the discretion of the Promoter.

Competition Eligibility

Open Competitions

Does not limit eligibility of participants, or limits it only to a broad group or particular geographical location (e.g. professional or student; local or international).

Invited Competitions

Promoter to invite a number of named architects to submit design for a competition. Each participant invited must be remunerated upon submission of a bona fide design.

Restricted Competitions

Promoter to limit participation to professionals with specific qualifications, i.e. having certain expertise and experience.


Competition Staging

Single Stage Competitions

Most suited where only a very broad conceptual solution is sought or where the brief is highly developed and clearly defined. Recommended for small scale projects only.

Two-stage Competitions

Where detailed design concepts are required, a two-stage process allow less suitable entries to be filtered out before the participants are required to expend unreasonable levels of time or cost in preparing their entries at own cost. It can also allow for Promoter to feedback on the shortlisted entries before the final submission. Entrants may also be requested to provide a fee proposal for subsequent engagement.



Compiling the Competition Document

Competition Document comprises design brief and competition conditions. The success of a competition is largely influenced by the quality of the design brief as it will have a critical bearing in the participants' response. The brief should be well presented, unambiguous and as informative as possible, clearly setting out the requirements but enabling the participant freedom of design interpretation.

Design Brief

- Objectives
- Background
- · Coverage of the competition
- Site information
- Functional and technical requirements, and identify the mandatory requirements
- Other supporting documents e.g. reports, standards (planning guide, environmental standards, universal access & code reference, etc)
- Budget of the project
- List of documents available to the participants

- Non-eligibility
- Timetable
- Submission requirements
- Evaluation criteria
- Honoraria or prize money
- Correspondence (competition website & email)
- Implementation of winning entry


